DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATIONS

ALAMEDA COUNTY PROBATION DEPARTMENT

Aims to serve and protect diverse communities and to offer rehabilitative opportunities to offenders. Services include substance abuse programs, citizenship training, and gender specific programs.

API EDUCATION TASKFORCE

An advocacy body within the Oakland Unified School District that promotes quality education programs to meet the needs of API students. The taskforce advocates for youth development programs, parent involvement in school and community decision making processes, as well as for API staff members within the OUSD who are experienced in providing services to API students.

API LEGAL OUTREACH

Provides advocacy to those in API communities seeking legal advice or assistance in culturally and linguistically appropriate ways. The practice currently focuses on the areas of family law/domestic violence, immigration rights, anti-trafficking, and youth rights. Services, which include a legal advice call center and legal representation, are often free or on a sliding-scale basis.

ASIAN COMMUNITIES FOR REPRODUCTIVE JUSTICE

ACRJ is a social, political and economic justice organization working for the liberation of API women. They develop grassroots organizing and leadership skills that are culture and gender specific.

ASIAN COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Provides and advocates for multicultural, multilingual family health services that include substance abuse treatment programs, mental health services, youth programs, family support services as well as programs for the developmentally disabled.

ASIAN DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PREVENTION COLLABORATIVE

API Legal Outreach's violence prevention program for youth providing art and media-based activities, and include violence prevention workshops, magazine, and website design.

ASIAN HEALTH SERVICES

A community health center that works to assure access to health care services regardless of income, insurance status, language, or culture. Services include medical care, health education, insurance counseling, and client advocacy to the Alameda County API population.

ASIAN IMMIGRANT WOMEN ADVOCATES

Works to improve the living and working conditions of low-income Asian immigrant women and families through political education, leadership development, and collective action campaigns. AIWA's youth project, Youth Build Immigrant Power (YBIP), works with low-income Asian immigrant youth to develop their organizing and leadership skills.

ASIAN PACIFIC ENVIRONMENTAL NETWORK

Seeks to empower low-income API communities to achieve environmental and social justice through direct and grassroots organizing. Projects include the Laotian Organizing Project, Asian Youth Advocates, and Power in Asians Organizing.

ASIAN PACIFIC PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES

Community-based mental health agency committed to providing culturally and linguistically competent mental health services to API families who otherwise have limited access to care. Services that are made available include psychotherapy, crisis intervention, substance abuse treatment and prevention, as well as family violence management and prevention.

ASIAN YOUTH SERVICES COMMITTEE

An Oakland based youth service club for teens from high school level to age 21. Youth learn leadership skills through planning activities and large events such as school dances, youth retreats, and basketball tournaments, for themselves and their peers.

ASSOCIATION OF ASIAN PACIFIC COMMUNITY HEALTH ORGANIZATIONS

A national association representing community health organizations dedicated to promoting advocacy, collaboration, and leadership that improves the health status and access of APIs. Diabetes care and prevention and tobacco control are among some of the programs currently offered.

ASIAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER YOUTH PROMOTING ADVOCACY AND LEADERSHIP

A youth community organizing program that brings together API high school students to promote social justice. Students are encouraged to develop leadership skills through team building exercises, skill training, education, and API workshops.

CAMBODIAN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, INC.

Assists Cambodian refugees in overcoming social, cultural, and economic barriers to reach independence and self-sufficiency. Services include job readiness training and development, mental health programs, culture and literacy classes, and a youth violence prevention program.

CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL SOUTHEAST ASIAN CLINIC

Pediatric health care clinic treating children from birth to age 19. Interpreter services in multiple languages and dialects are provided for immunizations, laboratory and pharmacy services, social services and well child services.

EAST BAY ASIAN LOCAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, INC.

A community economic development organization dedicated to the improvement of API communities through the development of physical, human, and economic assets for individuals and community organizations. EBALDC offers assistance in affordable housing, business planning, and marketing assistance to small businesses. Programs also include family money-management classes.

EAST BAY ASIAN YOUTH CENTER

A youth service organization, EBAYC is an on school site organization providing after school programs, as well as mentoring and tutoring, sports, media design and production, and youth leadership projects. EBAYC is also involved in parent organizing and advocacy.

EAST BAY VIETNAMESE ASSOCIATION

Provides multiple services to facilitate the transition of Vietnamese refugees to the East Bay. These include employment development, vocational training, citizenship classes, and parenting education.

FAMILY BRIDGES

A multi-service agency providing a variety of programs for the community. These programs include an adult health care center, a senior center, and a youth services program. The **Legal Language Access Project** provides translation and interpretation services. Currently, the project has capacity in the following languages: Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian (BCS), Burmese, Chinese (including Cantonese, Mandarin, Taiwanese, and Toishanese), Dari, Farsi, Hindi, Japanese, Khmer (Cambodian), Korean, Lao, Pashto, Punjabi, Russian, Spanish, Tagalog, and Vietnamese.

FILIPINOS FOR AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

A multi-service and civil rights advocacy organization committed to educating and empowering communities in need. Assistance for Filipino newcomers in the areas of employment, immigration, and housing are available. Youth development services are also available, and are linked to several San Francisco Bay Area schools.

HUONG VIET COMMUNITY CENTER

Through educational, social, and cultural programs, Huong Viet Community Center supports the development of the Vietnamese American community and family. The Center provides a tutoring and mentoring program for English learners among other services.

KOREAN COMMUNITY CENTER OF THE EAST BAY

Strives to empower the Korean American and other communities of the San Francisco Bay Area through education, advocacy, services, and the development of community based resources. Services are offered in the areas of immigration, domestic violence, youth development, and senior support.

LAO FAMILY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, INC.

Assists members of the Southeast Asian refugee and immigrant communities to adapt to life in the U.S. and to achieve social and economic self-sufficiency. Offers job placement assistance, referral and employment counseling, basic skills, leadership development, financial literacy, and work internships. Other services include gang prevention and pregnancy prevention programs for young adults.

NARIKA

By embracing the notion of women's empowerment, Narika addresses the unmet needs of abused South Asian women by providing advocacy, support, information, and referrals. Services include a helpline, direct aid, as well as outreach programs for men and young adults.

OAKLAND ASIAN CULTURAL CENTER

Showcases a wide range of cultural and artistic expression including dance, literature, music, and the visual arts. Offers facilities for cultural events, meetings, and workshops in the heart of Oakland Chinatown.

OAKLAND ASIAN STUDENTS EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

A social service organization dedicated to serving immigrant youth living in Oakland. Provides a series of academic and social enrichment programs for youth including tutorials, computer skills development trainings, and UC Berkeley mentoring.

OAKLAND PUBLIC LIBRARY, ASIAN BRANCH

Dedicated to providing quality services to the diverse peoples that reside in Oakland, and to promote a better understanding and appreciation of various cultures. Staff is multilingual, and programs such as bilingual storytelling and author readings are sponsored throughout the year.

PACIFIC ISLANDER KIE ASSOCIATION

A grassroots volunteer organization advocating and promoting the empowerment of Pacific Islander families and youth through education, parent training, legal aid services, cultural preservation projects, and contemporary arts projects.

PROTECTION & ADVOCACY, INC.

Offers free legal and advocacy services for people with disabilities throughout the state, such as publications, trainings, technical assistance and representation to ensure that children and youth obtain positive behavior intervention services and other needed mental health services.

UNITED LAOTIAN COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, INC.

Dedicated to assisting the Laotian community in the areas of job training, readiness, and training. Acts as a liaison between community members, the housing authority, and other government organizations.

YOUTH TOGETHER

Youth Together facilitates community empowerment, health, and justice through the development of youth leaders and organizers grounded in the principles of multiracial unity, justice, and peace. Student organizing teams are in place in several schools throughout the Bay Area.
